

Timeline - Pwllcrochan

- 1680 Robert Conway acquired land c.1680, first mansion called Pwllcrochan built
- 1693 Death of Robert Conway of Pwllcrochan
- 1702 Burial of John Conway of Pwllcrochan
- 1738 Robert Williams of Pwllcrochan marries Miss Jane Holland of Conway
- 1747 Robert Williams of Pwllcrochan is made High Sheriff
- 1760 Death of Robert Williams, aged 44
- 1776 Holland Williams makes a map of the Pwllcrochan Estate
- 1799 Death of Holland Williams of Pwllcrochan, aged 57
- 1803 Old Price born at Pwllcrochan
- 1808 Pwllcrochan inherited by Jane Silence Williams
- 1809 Death of Rev. Hugh Williams, owner of Pwllcrochan, and father of Lady Erskine
- 1821 Prices leave Pwllcrochan for Bodnant
- 1821 Jane Silence Williams marries Sir David Erskine
- 1823 Sir David Erskine, High Sheriff
- 1826 Erskines awarded £26,000 compensation for the loss of Menai Ferry
- 1827 Llandudno described by Old Price as "a small, scattered hamlet"
- 1841 Death of Sir David Erskine, aged 48
- 1865 Sir Thomas Erskine decides to sell Pwllcrochan
- 1866 Pwllcrochan converted into a hotel by John Porter when leased from owner John Pender
- 1875 Estate sold by John Pender
- 1875 Final break-up of the Pwllcrochan Estate. Colwyn Bay begins to take shape
- 1887 New wing added
- 1938 Pwllcrochan sold to Rydal School by the Porter Family
